

How to submit for Out-of-Network Benefits

Call the member services number on the back of your insurance card and tell them you would like to know about your coverage for speech therapy with an Out-of-Network provider.

Questions to ask when talking to your insurance company:

- What is my coverage for speech therapy benefits?
- Do I need pre-authorization for speech therapy? If so, how do I obtain it?
- What forms do I need to submit when filing my claim? Where can I find them?
- How do I file my claim? Online, mail, fax?
- Do I need to file my claim within a certain amount of time after the date of service?
- Do I need a superbill from the speech-language pathologist?
- How long does it take to process my claim?
- What can I do if you deny the insurance claim?
- What is the process for filing a claim after I have a superbill for services?

I may be able to let you know which of the following codes you should give your insurance company based on the information you provide me during the initial consultation. However, these may change after the formal evaluation.

Speech Therapy CPT Codes:

92522 - Evaluation for speech sound production

92523 - Evaluation for speech AND language skills

92507 - Treatment of speech, language, communication disorder; individual

The actual diagnosis codes will be determined at the time of the evaluation. Speech Therapy Diagnosis (ICD-10) Codes:

F80.0 - Articulation/phonological disorder

F80.1 - Expressive language disorder

F80.2 - Mixed receptive-expressive language disorder

F80.4 - Speech & language delay due to hearing loss (chronic ear infection)

F84.0 - Autistic disorder

R48.2 - Apraxia of speech

R48.8 - Other symbolic dysfunctions

R47.89 - Other speech disturbances
